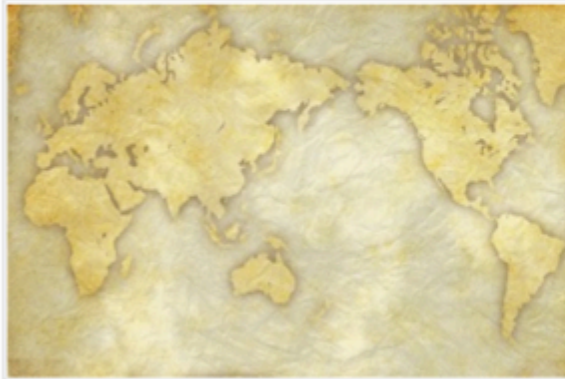
The Asian Association of Veterinary Schools (AAVS)
