

- 250 HK students in training in various institutions overseas at any one time *(mostly Australia, UK, some US)*



Our overall goal is to improve quality of life and the health of people, animals and the environment under the One Health paradigm, and to ensure sustainable food production through the promotion of animal welfare.






Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory (VDL)


