AAVS President gave a welcome address to Executive Committee (EC) members and observers (Annex 1).

The Secretary General, Dr Haga, announced the EC meeting agenda (Annex 2 – slide #2).

Agenda 3: Overview of AAVS activities since the 20th Meeting (Annex 2 – slides #3-7)

The Secretary General, Dr Haga, briefly described the recent activities:

- Launch of the AAVS Strategic Plan 2022-2026 in March 2022
- Establishment of 2 working groups: Veterinary Education Enhancement (VEE) chaired by Prof. Omar, AAVS President, and Prof. Chang, AAVS Vice President, and Veterinary Education Research (VER) chaired by Prof. Hafsa.
- Establishment of FAVA-AAVS Joint Education Committee
- Posting of FAVA Congress 2022 recording to AAVS Website

Agenda 4: Update on AAVS Office operation (Annex 2 – slides #8-13)

Dr Haga briefly explained the legal establishment of AAVS Office in 2017. The current roles and responsibilities of AAVS Office are the same as those explained at the 20th EC Meeting. The AAVS Office is supported by WOAH Regional Representation for Asia and the Pacific staff and the Fellows of the University of Tokyo and Interns. Since the 20th EC Meeting, AAVS Office released one Newsletter issue (No.4) which is available through the AAVS website. Dr Haga also reported that the name of Kei-ichiro Maeda Memorial Ise Award was changed to the Kei-ichiro Maeda Memorial T&C Award 2023 due to the change of sponsoring company's name. The winners of this year's award, selected from 6 applications received, were

- Dr Jaechul Lim, Seoul National University

Agenda 5: Report from Extraordinary EC Meetings (May 19th and August 2nd) (Annex 2 – slides #14-24)

Dr Haga reported the summary of discussions and decisions made in the two extraordinary EC Meetings. In the EC Meeting on 19th May, the procedure of EC Member election described in the Operational document was reviewed and the timeline for new EC Member selection was discussed. The draft expression of interest (EOI) form was also reviewed. Further, updates on MoU with FAVA were provided and EC supported its signing during the 21st AAVS Meeting. In the EC Meeting on 2nd August, the candidates/nominations for new AAVS EC Members including President, Vice President, and Secretary General, was discussed. Also, the host of AAVS Annual Meeting in 2024 was decided to be Seoul National University. Dr Haga also informed that in line with the operational document, EOIs submitted were posted on the password protected section of AAVS Website for AAVS Members to review.

Agenda 6: Financial report (Annex 2 – slides #25-26)

The Treasurer, Dr Takiguchi, gave an interim financial report for 2023. AAVS's fund is in JPY but reported in USD for easy understanding.

Summary of interim financial statement for the Period of 1 January to 31 August 2023:

- Total income is 30 thousand 175 dollars and 70 cents.
- Total expenditure is 4 thousand 3 dollars and 72 cents.
- So, the Balance as of August 31st 2023 equals 26 thousand 171 dollars and 98 cents.
- Regarding expenditure, foreign exchange valuation loss of about 2 thousand 348 dollars was incurred due to the depreciation of Japanese yen (Japanese yen depreciated by 10%)

compared to the end of 2022).

Agenda 7: Membership status (Annex 2 – slides #27-28)

Dr Haga reported the membership status:

- As of September 2023, there are 53 Regular Members and 1 Associate Member.
- The regular members consist of 46 active members who paid membership fee for 2023 and 7 inactive members who have not paid membership fee for 2023.
- Two new members Azabu University and University of Miyazaki, joined AAVS.
- 1 regular member lost membership due to not paying membership fees for more than 3 years.

AAVS Activities

Updates by working groups

Since time was limited, the working group updates were decided to be delivered during the Assembly meeting.

Collaboration with other organizations (e.g., SEAVSA, FAVA))

AAVS and FAVA will sign MoU and will try to implement some activities jointly.

Teaching Resource Sharing Platform

Dr Haga reminded the EC Members about the resource sharing platform established in June 2021 on the password protected site for AAVS members. He commented that this platform is not fully utilized. Some EC Members requested AAVS Office to share more information about the platform since they were not familiar with the platform.

Upcoming activities

AAVS Office will send the annual letter to all Members in November, requesting updates of contact info with the invoice for 2024 membership fee. Next issue of eNewsletter is planned to be issued before the end of year. Providing Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Credits for joining AAVS activities was discussed because it will serve as incentives to encourage more AAVS Members to participate. One challenge is that countries have different CPD systems – this maybe explored for FAVA congress. Some potential ideas for AAVS activities such as use of AI in veterinary medicine was discussed.

The 22nd AAVS Meeting

Dr Kim proposed to organize the meeting, hosted by Seoul National University, in association with FAVA Congress on 27 October 2024 in hybrid modality. He will try to arrange a bus from Daejeon, where FAVA Congress will be held, to Seoul for AAVS Members to visit the campus of Seoul National University.





- 3.2. The Parties recognise that the collaborative activities referred to in paragraph 3.1 will be conducted by way of separate, written agreements. Those agreements will set out the Parties' various rights and obligations in respect of those activities.

4. DURATION

- 4.1. Subject to paragraph 4.2, this MOU will commence on the date it is fully executed and will last for three (3) years from the date of signing.
- 4.2. Either Party may terminate this MOU by giving the other Party 6 months' written notice of termination

5. NOMINATED REPRESENTATIVES

5.1. The Parties' nominated representatives are:

5.2. Each Party's nominated representative is responsible for the development and implementation of this MOU, including receiving and acting on proposals for collaborative activities referred to in paragraph 3.1.

6. LEGAL ISSUES

Nothing in this MOU will create a legal relationship between the Parties or be legally binding on them. This MOU is to affirm the intent of the Parties to work together in good faith in an attempt to progress the matters described in this MOU.


