

FAVA STRATEGIC PLAN IMPLEMENTATION PROGRAM ON VETERINARY EDUCATION

Improve the quality and status of veterinary education of member countries

- 1) Increase engagement, collaboration and exchange between Veterinary Education Establishments (VEEs) and other related organisations in member countries.
- 2) Establish an educational platform and consider sustainable veterinary education.

Assist all FAVA member countries in strengthening veterinary educational standard.

- 1) Share the information on the veterinary educational standard in the USA, EU and Australasia.
- 2) Support the harmonisation of veterinary education in Asia.
- 3) Establish a cooperation platform with ASEAN Veterinary Statutory Body Network (AVSBN).

Develop a common self-assessment tool for veterinary colleges with the Asian Association of Veterinary Schools (AAVS) or other regional veterinary school associations.

- 1) Share the information on veterinary education in each country.
- 2) Establish a cooperation platform with AAVS.
- 3) Establish a cooperation platform with the regional veterinary school associations in member countries.

Develop Continuing Professional Development (CPD) programmes training and seminars by exchanging experts among member countries.

- 1) Investigate the current status of CPD in each member country.
- 2) Share information on the possibility of providing CPD implemented by each country to other FAVA member countries.

Activities Carried Out

- 1. Establish a Veterinary Education Committee in FAVA as a Standing Committee.
- 2. Conducting **various meetings** with various organizations engaged in veterinary education
- 3. Together with AAVS was established the **Joint Education Committee (JEC)** for standardization of veterinary education, accreditation, etc.
- 4. Together with AVBS holding **webinars and mentoring workshops** for several veterinary education establishments
- 5. **Exchange guest professors/Lecturers** among universities in veterinary education
- 6. Developed **Qualities and Competencies** through Undergraduate Veterinary Education
- 7. FAVA **Education portal** in FAVA Website.
