




### WOAH Competency and Curriculum Guidelines for Veterinarians, VPPs and Community Animal Health Workers

Describes various courses and cross-references them with the Day 1 Competencies that each course should address













#### Networking to strengthen veterinary education

- Both VEEs and VSBs play a key role in ensuring the effectiveness of veterinary professionals and delivery of competent Veterinary Services (VS).
- In Asia, more than 300 VEEs exist with diverse course curricula, standards and delivery methods.
- Majority of VEEs are accredited by national accreditation systems, but no regional VEE accreditation standards / body exists.
- Networking and networks among VEEs and VSBs provides valuable opportunities for information and resource sharing towards harmonised curriculum and accreditation processes
- Better education standards and outcomes
- Better delivery of veterinary services
- Better animal health and welfare



Close collaboration is encouraged to ensure the provision of veterinary education is appropriate to the needs of each country
